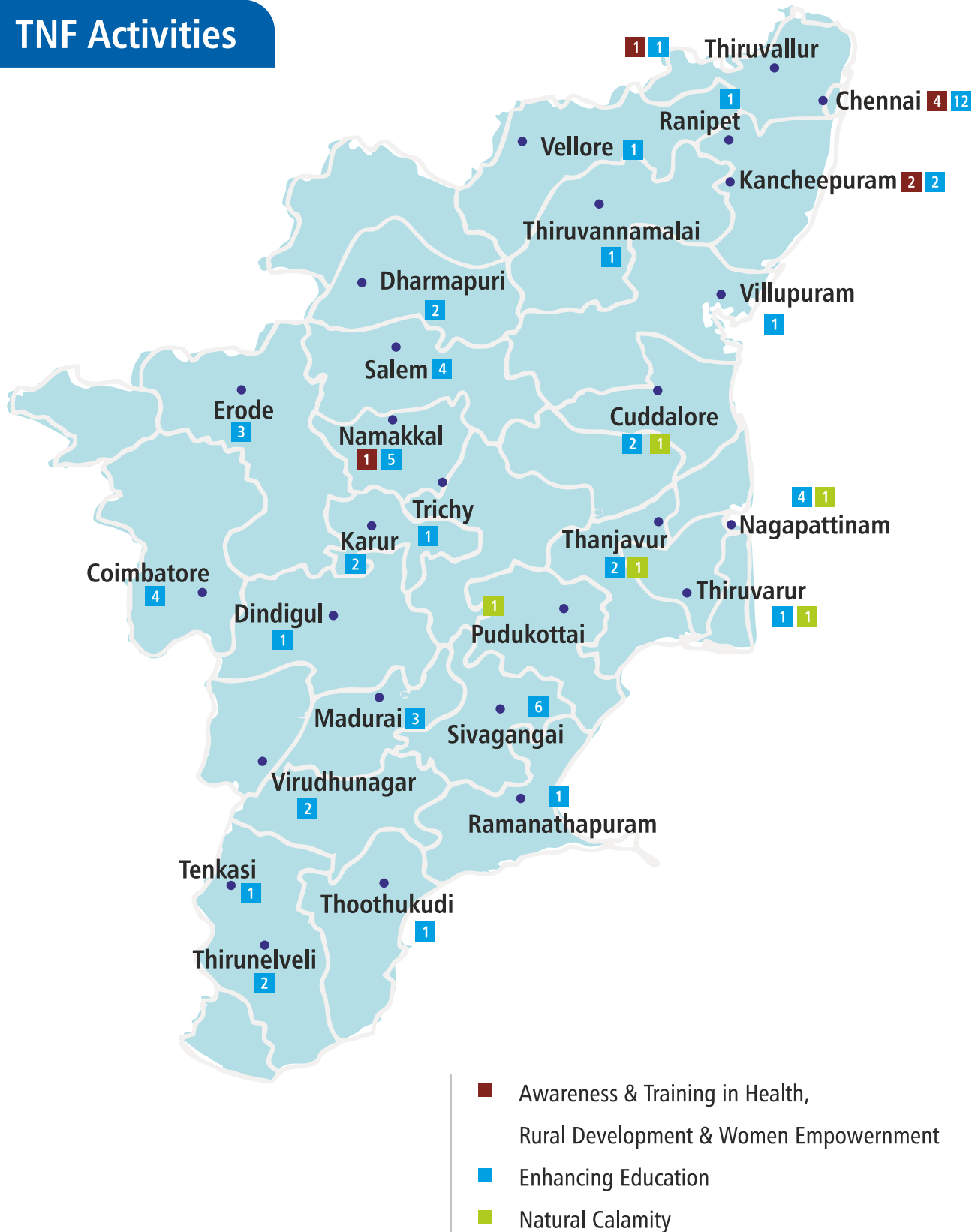

Unique aspects of the TNF – ABC Model

A- Achieving Grade Level Proficiency Uplifting the “Slow Learners”

Special classes are conducted in the adopted schools by TNF – ABC teachers for students identified as “Slow Learners” by their teachers. The intent of these classes is to help students to develop proficiency in the fundamentals and pass the final exam.

With a sense of pride, we look back on our endeavours to achieve through **Academic Bridge Course** introduced in Sivagangai District in the year 2012, now extended to 62 schools in 14 districts, What the Noble Prize Winning Economists have envisaged in **Poor Economics**, to have a school system that gives a chance to every child.

Paranthaman is one among the students of Government High School, Ettukudi, Nagapatinam District in the TNF ABC Class. “I didn't know how to read or write a single sentence in English and Tamil. My friends didn't talk to me properly and I felt embarrassed because of that. After TNF gave special coaching classes, I am able to read and write and gathered my interests to study more and I am confident that I will get good marks.”

A two-day soft skills training programme was organized at Government High School, Anvarthikanpet in October 2018. One of the students named **Rishwana Fathima** says, "I got the opportunity to participate in the two days training on soft skills where I learned about Self Confidence, Concentration and Memory Skills and got to know about different courses to study after 10th and 12th classes. They also gave some puzzles and games and gave ideas on how to write well and score top marks in the board exams which was very useful to us."



C – Championing for Higher Aspirations

With the help of the Head Master and Teachers, students with higher aspirations and capabilities are identified, and other ambitions are nurtured through individual or group-oriented initiatives such as:

- College visits
- College application process support

Ramya from Government Higher Secondary School, Maduranthagallur, Cuddalore says “I was one among the student who went on a College exposure tour organized by Tamil Nadu Foundation. TNF took us to Annamalai University in Chidambaram. We were taken to all the departments where the Professors explained the courses offered, the eligibility criteria and the facilities available in each department. Later in the afternoon, we were all gathered in a hall where, the Dean and some of the professors explained on how to manage stress, how to focus on preparing for examination and how to start preparing from now to choose our career.”

All the Teachers engaged in coaching the students of ABC Project are given training with the following objectives.

- To motivate and inspire teachers towards their progression.
- To empower teachers to self-analyze how they teach and find ways to improve their teaching.
- To provide practical tools to better manage and motivate students.
- To bridge the understanding and relationship gap between teachers and students.
- To build team spirit and cooperation among teachers for mutual support and resolving challenges.

Aiming to achieve the objectives, TNF has collaborated with **Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA)**, **Government of Tamil Nadu** and organized training programmes to the teachers.



Salient Features of the Training

- 1) Focusing on importance of having a vision and its role on transformation.
- 2) Developing specific teaching methods in English, Mathematics, Science.
- 3) Enhancing teachers ability to create to build child centric curriculum and assessment model to motivate the academically challenged students.

Two-day training programme was organized through **Central Chinmaya Mission Education Cell (CCMT)** during April 2019 at Coimbatore.

E – Libraries are Temples

During the **National Library Week** celebration in November 2018, various competitions were held in the TNF ABC Project Schools and the best students in Elocution, Essay Writing and Drawing were awarded with a cash prize during the function organized in the near by district libraries. Besides, one library in each district closer to TNF ABC Project School was identified and basic infrastructure was improved by undertaking repair and renovation works.

d) Digital Classroom

TNF launched the digital classroom project in September 2018 in Govt Hr. Sec School, CMDA Colony, Arumbakkam which is a huge success and benefits hundreds of students.

The main objectives of the Digital Classroom:

- To facilitate students of class 6-8 in the school to learn English and Mathematics with the help of various learning modules.
- To empower the deprived students access technology by providing hands on training.

J.Sivagamasundari, Maths Teacher “Digital Classroom eases the learning process of all students. It creates a flexible environment for student teacher engagement and open doors to new experiences. It also helps students to understand the concepts better and they show more interest in activity-based learning which makes them perform well during the exams specially in Mathematics.”

G. Karthikeyan Class VII student “I really like coming to the computer lab and able to learn well and good. Initially I was not able to score good marks in Mathematics and English. Later learning through computer regularly, I have secured good marks in both the subjects and understood the concepts better. Now, I feel more confident towards studies and motivated to learn new things every day.”

III. GAJA Cyclone Relief and Rehabilitation Projects

a) Roof for the Roofless Project

To mitigate the sufferings of the people affected by GAJA Cyclone in the Thiruvarur and Nagapattinam Districts of Tamil Nadu, Rural Development and Local Administration have announced construction of concrete houses under Pradan Mandri Awas Yojana (Gramin) (PMAY) scheme.

The beneficiaries mostly daily wage earners have expressed their difficulties in meeting the convergence cost of PMAY Scheme. Based on the representation and in consultation with Rural Development and Local Administration Department Officials, Housing Project to provide assistance up to basement level was designed by **Tamil Nadu Foundation** to help **100 Beneficiaries identified by Rural Development Department, Government of Tamil Nadu.**



Total Cost of the Project: Rs. 47 Lakhs

b) Assistance from Srinivasan Services Trust

Srinivasan Services Trust supported Construction of Basement of 23 Houses in Nagapattinam District.



Total Cost of the Project: Rs. 10.81 Lakhs

Fund Raising Program

In addition to the funds received from USA, TNF conducted a local fund-raising event **"Kadai Ezhu Vallagal"**, a dance drama for "Roof for the Roofless Project" at Egmore Museum, Chennai.



c) Rehabilitation Works at Schools



Construction of Toilet at Government High School, Seruthur in Nagapattinam District which benefitted 250 Students

Total Cost of the Project – Rs.5.75 Lakhs

Roof Fitting work was done at Government High School, Thalaikadu in Nagapatinam District which benefitted 130 Students.

Total Cost of the Project – Rs.28,000



Construction of Borewell at Government High School, Katchanam in Thiruvarur District which benefitted 192 Students.

Total Cost of the Project – Rs.78,000

Construction of Cycle Shed at Govt. Higher Secondary School, Nedumbalam in Thiruvarur District which benefitted 980 Students.

Total Cost of the Project – Rs.30,000



Installation of Water Tanks at Government Higher Secondary School, Nedumbalam & Government Higher Secondary School, Thiruthooripoondi in Thiruvarur District and Government High School, Seruthur in Nagapatinam District which benefitted 1700 Students.

Total Cost of the Project – Rs.20,000

d) Relief Activities at Lakshminarayanapuram Village

TNF has undertaken relief activities to support the people affected by GAJA Cyclone in Pudukkottai District.

- JCP was used to clear uprooted trees in 100-acre land and made it fit for cultivation.
- Distributed 3200 Coconut Seedlings of Tall variety which benefitted 128 Farmers.
- 20 Solar Street Lights were erected at important places for the benefit of 250 Families.



e) Relief Activities at Muthanpallam Village

- Distributed 10 Bicycles to the school going children
- Distributed 5 Solar Street lights to cyclone affected areas



Total Cost of the Project: Rs. 9.57 Lakhs

IV. Assistance to Orphaned Girl Children Project - Kundrakudi



TNF provides assistance to deserving girl children below 18 years of age and also ensures their care and protection in a children home at Kundrakudi in Sivagangai District.

TNF also encourages them to pursue their talents and interests.

V. Assistance to Special School for Orphaned Special Needs Children Project - Sirkazhi

TNF provides assistance to the special needs children that includes mentally retarded, cerebral palsy, down syndrome, autism, and multiple disability in a Special School at Sirkazhi in Sivagangai District.

TNF has developed a plan to elevate and establish the special needs children home as a role model center for rural special needs children. After the continuous efforts of TNF, Special School for Orphaned Special Needs Children has reached a self-sustainable stage to support its needs.

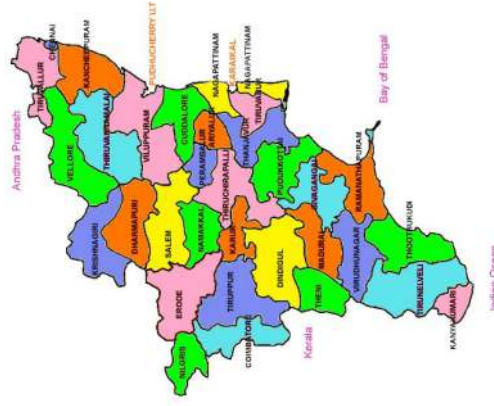

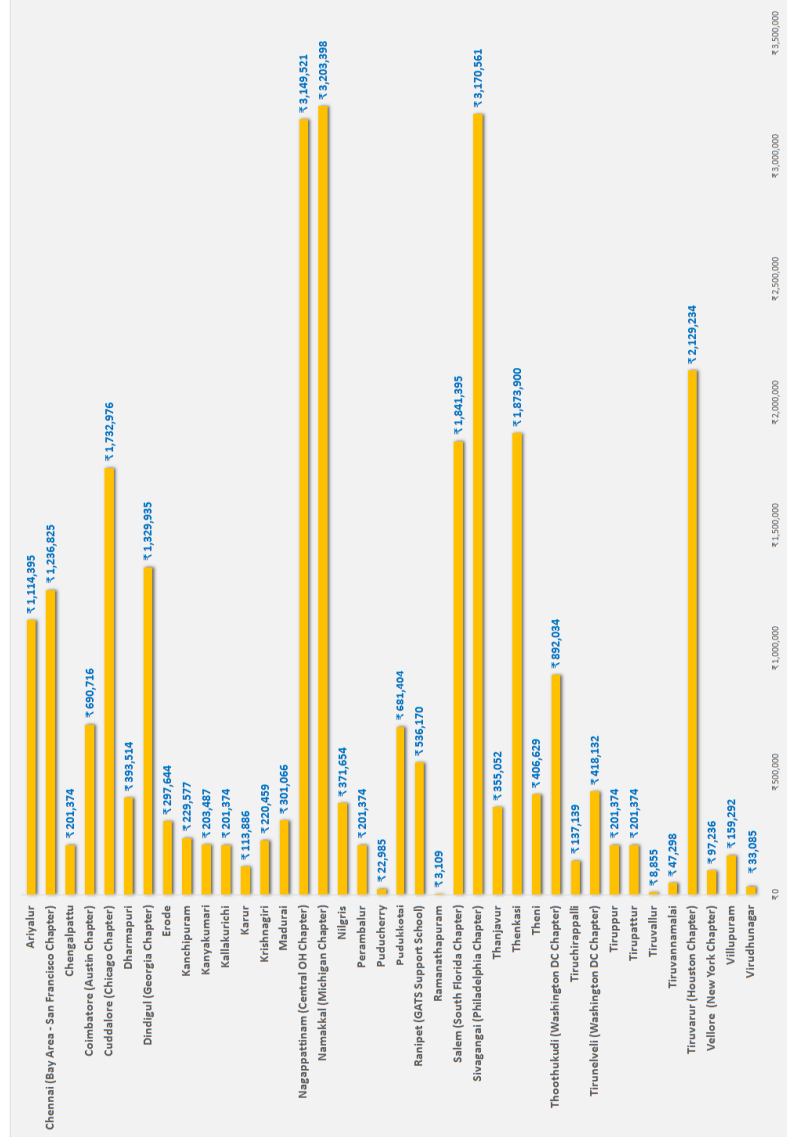

XI. Chennai Innovation & Technology Incubation Center (CI-TIC)



TNF in collaboration with Tiruchirappalli Regional Engineering College Science and Technology Entrepreneurs Park (TREC – STEP) set up a Chennai Innovation & Technology Incubation Center (CI – TIC) in TNF Chennai. TREC STEP is a renowned technology business incubator and leading developmental not for profit organization.

The objective of the Chennai Innovation & Technology Incubation Center is to identify the educated youth in rural & urban areas and provide them opportunity and encourage their innovative ideas in various technology for sustainable development, utilizing the resources, facilities and capacities of both TNF & TREC STEP.

To access new gen high growth ventures, CITIC organized Chennai NEXT – New Exciting Technology Challenge in October, 2018. TREC-STEP incubation team has extensively used the social networking platforms such as LinkedIn, Facebook, Google search engine optimization techniques to effectively reach-out to over 2,00,000 start-up enthusiasts, students and potential entrepreneurs. TREC-STEP Incubation team has also organized interaction sessions with the academia, investor community, EDII Chennai, incubation centres, etc. to provide ample visibility for the Start-up Challenge. 1000 Expression of Interests was received and a database of these innovative products/processes has been collected as a valuable repository for future access. CITIC Team has designed an elaborate application process with technical feasibility analysis, business model, financial, video demos, etc. for the initial 1000 applications, CITIC team has received 130 full applications with complete technical and financial details.





Further CITIC Incubation team has organized Chennai NEXT Star-up Talks in November, 2018. Ice breaking sessions with 130 Venture teams enabled CITIC to understand where the ventures stand in their Start-up journey. These interaction sessions were immensely beneficial to categorize and customize incubation offerings as Investment ready, Product ready and Early stage. The technology focus of the ventures is Smart Mobility, Data and AI, Food, Agri & Environment, Health, Industry, Defence, Bio-tech and other technologies.

130 start-up applications have been vetted by the technical team and 50 Finalist have been selected for the next round.

Students were provided Intern Opportunities @ the Incubated Start-Ups, a win situation both for the student community and the



start-ups. Initiatives are also being taken to map prospective mentors or investors from TNF who can provide their expertise and support to the start-ups.

The Indo US Science and Technology Forum is a bilateral apex Science Technology cooperation Agency Promoted by the Governments of the United States of America (through the Department of State) and India (through the Department of Science & Technology) and have established the United States – India Science & Technology Endowment Fund(USISTEF) for the promotion of joint activities that would lead to innovation and entrepreneurship through the application of Science and Technology. The aim of the Fund is support and foster joint applied R & D to generate public good through the commercialization of technology developed through sustained partnerships between U.S and Indian researchers and entrepreneurs.

Batch I profile consisting of 12 start – ups were also forwarded to TNF USA to find out a right partner. Total of 51 start – ups are expected.

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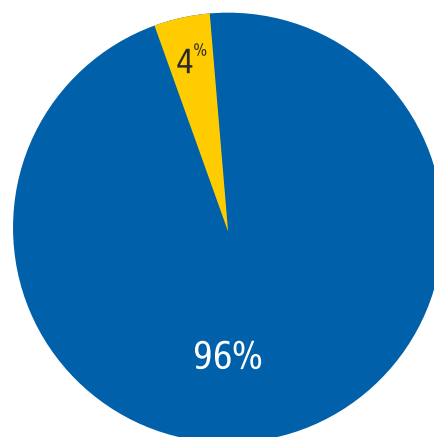

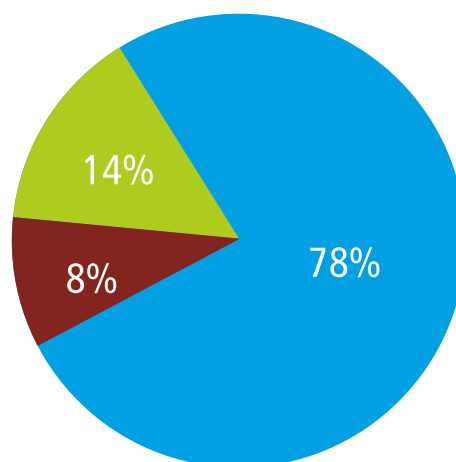
